DOMINION OF CANADA
The dream of a unified expansion into the territories of the North and West was brought closer to reality by the growth of the Canadian railroad system bridging the barriers of distance between the provinces and making confederation a reality. The Quebec Conference of 1864 framed the resolutions forming the basis of the British North America Act which on July 1, 1867 united the Provinces of Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick into the Dominion of Canada.
The "Large Queens" were the first stamps issued by the new Dominion.





<p>50TH YEAR CANADIAN FEDERATION</p> <p>1917</p>  <p>Fathers of the Confederation</p>	<p>Because of World War I, the 50th Anniversary of Confederation was celebrated with only a single stamp in 1917. The design is taken from the painting "Fathers of the Confederation" by Robert Harris and shows the meeting at the Parliament House in Quebec during the fall of 1864.</p> <p>With the war over, the Post Office was less restrained and the 60th Anniversary of Confederation was celebrated in high style in 1927. Two separate sets of stamps were issued, one known as the commemorative series consisting of five stamps and a Special Delivery and a second set of three values called the 'historical' issue. Major political figures and settings of the Confederation movement are depicted.</p>

KING GEORGE VI SERIES 1937

The Prince of Wales ascended the throne upon the death of King George V in January, 1936 and became King Edward VII. Stamps were being prepared, but had not been issued when he abdicated in December, giving the throne to his brother, the Duke of York, who became King George VI. The design planned for King Edward was used for the new king. This issue was the first Canadian series to depict the king in civilian attire.

One of the architects of dominion autonomy.</p> <p>The Right Honourable William Lyon Mackenzie King, Prime Minister 1921-1926 and 1935-1948. Great war-time premier. 

PIONEER SETTLERS



In 1905 two new provinces, Alberta and Saskatchewan, were carved out of the Northwest Territories. Regina, which had been the headquarters for the administration of the Territories, became the capital of Saskatchewan. Edmonton, a trade and transportation centre, became the capital of Alberta.

I.C.A.O.



The I.C.A.O. came into being on April 4, 1947 with permanent headquarters at Montreal. This United Nations organization is charged with coordinating and administering all aspects of international civil aviation including floating sea stations and weather-reporting services.

WORLD SCOUT JAMBOREE



The Boy Scout Emblem between two hemispheres commemorates the 8th Boy Scout World Jamboree, Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario.

FIRE PREVENTION



A small home engulfed by flames dramatizes the needless waste caused by preventable fires.

DAVID THOMPSON



English-born (1770-1857) explorer, geographer, and surveyor. He mapped over 1½ million square miles of Canada's wilderness.

To commemorate the birth centenary of Tom Thomson, the Clairmont, Ont. landscape painter, 1877-1917. "Autumn Birches" contrasts the arrival of spring as shown in "April in Algonquin Park."



CANADIAN-BORN GOVERNORS GENERAL

To honour Canadian-born Governors General: Vincent Massey appointed 25 years ago, Georges Philias, Daniel Roland Michener and the present-day Jules Léger.



ORDER OF CANADA

Instituted July 1, 1967, the Order of Canada rewards service, achievement and merit of a high degree, reflecting the spirit of the Order's motto, "They desire a better country."

These four ships were developed to combat the ever-dangerous Canadian winters and ice-covered waterways. The "Chief Justice Robinson," built in 1842, survived until 1857 and led to the building of the "Labrador" in 1954 for the Canadian navy. Today this vessel is used by the Coast Guard.



Designed by Will Davies, these stamps depict men working with air drills in a hardrock silver mine and one of the gigantic bucket-wheel excavators used in strip mining.



The latest addition to the endangered species series features the peregrine falcon, which has suffered a drastic decline since World War II that scientists attribute to the widespread use of pesticides. The slow elimination of these pesticides is giving this world-known species a fighting chance for survival, but additional programs are needed to save this bird from extinction.



FREDERICK PHILLIP GROVE AND EMILE NELLIGAN



German born Frederick Philip Grove left his homeland in 1909 under mysterious circumstances, emigrating to North America. He is best remembered for his realistic portrayals of life on the prairie during the years of rapid settlement. The stamp illustrates a scene from one of his books, *Fruits of the Earth*. Emile Nelligan's poetry is intensely personal. His short writing career ended when he sank into a profound depression, and from 1899, he spent the rest of his life in mental asylums. Monique Charbonneau's lovely woodcut celebrates his most famous poem, *Le Vaisseau D'or*.

DE SALABERRY AND JOHN BY



De Salaberry was commissioned in the British Army in 1794. He campaigned overseas and returned to Southern Canada in 1810. His most famous victory was the battle of Chateauguay in 1813. John By was commissioned in the Royal Artillery but was transferred to the Royal Engineers. He contributed to the building of both Quebec City and a canal at Les Cedres. In 1862, he supervised construction of the Rideau Canal, still in use today.

CANOE-KAYAK



In 1979, the Canoe-Kayak World Championships were held in Jonquiere and Desbiens, Quebec. This was the first time the event took place outside Europe. The course is at least 3 kilometers long and boasts numerous rapids, high waves, breakers and rollers.

WOMEN'S FIELD HOCKEY



About 40,000 Canadian women play field hockey. Fitness and stamina are essential for this popular sport since only two players can be substituted during a match. This year's World Championships took place in Vancouver.

INUIT SHELTER



Sc 838

The Inuit east of the Mackenzie River Delta used to live in tents during the summer. The tents were made of hides stretched over a frame of bones or driftwood. In the winter they moved to igloos. The average igloo was about three meters wide and two meters high and boasted a window of ice. It was warm and comfortable except for the disadvantage of cabin fever and if the igloo was erected on unstable ice, they could split apart and flood.

In marriage a person could legitimately have more than one spouse. The women butchered animals, cooked and sewed. A good seamstress was valued highly in the community because well made clothing allowed hunters to stand up in the coldest winter. While women also cared for the children, both parents gave them much affection.

CHRISTMAS



U.N. YEAR OF THE CHILD



The United Nations General Assembly declared 1979 the year of world concern for the present condition of children all over the world. The stamp shows a young girl watering a tree to symbolize growth and nourishment.

Arctic Islands Centenary



In 1880, Canada acquired Britain's claims to the Arctic Islands. This crowned ten years of national growth which had seen Canada absorb British Columbia, the Hudson's Bay Company territories, and Prince Edward Island. This was the first time a country gained so much territory so peacefully and so quickly.

Winter Olympics



The Winter Olympics took place at Lake Placid, New York in February 1980. The stamp features an action photograph of a skier on a downhill run. The photographer deliberately uses an out-of-focus technique to show the speed of downhill skiing.

Endangered Wildlife



Atlantic whitefish live in southern Nova Scotia. They belong to the salmon family. The fish spawn in fresh water but spend their adult lives in the sea. Factors such as pollution, overfishing and deforestation threaten the existence of the Atlantic whitefish. Prairie farming originally helped the greater prairie chicken expand its population and range but hunters began to slaughter thousands and settlers plowed up more and more of the prairie. In the past ten years, with the exception of a few sightings in Saskatchewan, the bird has almost disappeared from Canada.

Gardening



One of the most popular leisure-time activities in Canada is gardening. From May 17 to September 1, Canada hosted *Le Florales Internationales de Montréal*, one of the greatest horticultural exhibitions ever staged in North America.

Rehabilitation



The design of the stamp symbolizes the idea of people helping people — the motivating force behind rehabilitation. The Fourteenth World Congress of Rehabilitation International took place in Winnipeg, June 1980, as a prelude to the 1981 proclamation of the United Nations International Year for Disabled People.

John G. Diefenbaker



Diefenbaker was elected Prime Minister in 1957. Among the important things he was responsible for was the first woman federal cabinet minister, the first woman ambassador, enacting a bill of rights, and giving the Indians the right to vote. After his government was defeated in 1963, Diefenbaker resigned. He died in 1979.





<p>ANTIQUE INSTRUMENTS</p>  <p>The stamp above was issued during the 1980-1981 exhibition of historic musical instruments held at the Vancouver Centennial Museum. Depicted is an 18th-century mandora, a predecessor of the mandolin.</p>	<p>ENDANGERED WILDLIFE</p>  <p>The Vancouver Island marmot, threatened by man and other predators, is approaching extinction. Only between 50 and 100 survive on its island habitat. The wood bison, nearly exterminated by hunters and hard winters, has increased in numbers to about 800 with help from federal breeding programs.</p>
<p>EMILY STOWE Emily Stowe was Canada's first female school principal, first female physician, and founder of the nation's first women's suffrage society.</p> <p>IDOLA SAINT-JEAN Idola Saint-Jean was devoted to gaining the vote for Quebec women and to protesting women's inequality before the law.</p>	<p>LOUISE MCKINNEY Louise McKinney worked toward women's suffrage and alcohol prohibition and became the first female member of a British Commonwealth legislature.</p> <p>HENRIETTA EDWARDS Henrietta Edwards became an expert on Canadian laws affecting women and children. She participated in legal case which confirmed women's right to sit in the Canadian Senate.</p>

<p>BRUNET SCULPTURE</p>  <p>These two women were beatified by the Roman Catholic Church in 1980. Marie de l'Incarnation, founder of the Ursuline Order in Canada, dedicated herself to educating French and Indian girls.</p>

CANADIAN PAINTERS



Frederick H. Varley, a founding member of the Group of Seven, achieved greater notoriety from his landscapes, although he preferred painting people.



Marc-Aurèle Fortin believed that Canadian artists should take their inspiration from the countryside. Many of his works depict landscapes of the St. Lawrence Valley.



The paintings of Paul-Émile Borduas reflected his unshackled imagination. His style, called "automatisme," influenced many young painters.

CANADA DAY



These four stamps show the growth of the Canadian Confederation and the organization of the provinces and territories since 1867.

BOTANISTS



Issued to honour Frère Marie-Victorin (1855-1944), a leading authority on the geographical distribution of plants, and John Macoun (1831-1920), collector of over 100,000 plants now found in the National Herbarium in Ottawa.

Issued to mark the opening of a permanent outdoor botanical park on the site of Les Floralies internationales de Montreal, a floral exhibition held in 1980. The Montreal Rose was bred specially for the show and the City of Montreal.

NIAGARA—ON—THE—LAKE



Marks the 200th anniversary of the founding of Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario, the first capital of Upper Canada.

ACADIANS



Commemorates the centenary of the first Acadian Convention held at Memramcook, New Brunswick. At this and other conventions during the 1880s, the Acadians chose a national feast day, flag, and patron saint.

AARON MOSHER



Aaron Mosher (1881-1959) was a union organizer for over fifty years and founder of the Canadian Labour Congress.

CANADA DAY



Investigation of the unknown land of New France by these explorers brought a new and greater understanding of the terrain and its native inhabitants.



Canadian innovators in communications are honoured here. Charles Fenerty created the world's first practical newsprint from wood; Frederick Gisborne's undersea cable stretched from New Brunswick to Prince Edward Island; George Edouard Desbarats and William Leggo produced the first halftone engraving for publishing photographs; and Reginald Fessenden broadcast human voices through the air with his invention, the AM radio.





Canadian football marks the 75th Grey Cup. Originating in 1909 with a trophy for amateur championship, by 1948 this event was more than the professional team championship, but also a nationwide festival.

These sombre portrayals mark two wildlife and habitat conservation milestones: The 100th birth anniversary of Archibald Belaney or "Grey Owl" and the 50th anniversary of Ducks Unlimited Canada.

A masterpiece, "The Young Reader," by Ozias Leduc, portrays the painter's brother and is part of the National Gallery of Canada collection.

EXPLORERS



The exploration of Western Canada is examined in this block of four commemorating the men who traveled the Prairies and British Columbia between 1754 and 1861. Henday's journey and account of the Blackfoot Indians, Vancouver's detailed maps, Fraser's expedition beyond the Rocky Mountains and Palliser's assessment of the Western region's agricultural potential and accessibility all contributed to the emergence of the nation.







PREHISTORIC LIFE



Primitive life which existed thousands of years ago in Canada and is found in fossilized form today is featured in this block of four. Shown are the trilobite from the Cambrian Period, a sea scorpion from the Silurian Period, stromatolites from the Precambrian Period and a soft-bodied marine invertebrate from the Cambrian Period.

The age of primitive vertebrates is featured on this block of four. Shown are the lobe-finned fish from the Devonian Period, fossilized mouth parts of small eel-like creatures, a land reptile from the Carboniferous Period and a giant fossilized tree from the Devonian Period.

Commemorating the 124th anniversary of Confederation, a day of national celebration.




Small pleasure craft are depicted on this block of four. The verichere rowboat is flat-bottomed and first appeared in the St. Lawrence in the mid-1800s. The touring kayak is wider and longer than its white-water counterpart to offer greater stability. The sailing dinghy, used for racing or pleasure sailing is small and portable. The cedar strip canoe offers a smooth ride for avid canoeists.

Rivers shown in this booklet include the South Nahanni River which flows out of the Yukon and contains the scenic Virginia Falls, the Athabasca River, the longest river in Alberta, the Boundary Waters - Voyageur Waterway which flows between Canada and the U.S., the Jacques-Cartier River in Quebec, known for its beauty and historic value as an early travel and trade route, and the Main River, on the Great Northern Peninsula, one of the last remaining near-wilderness areas of Newfoundland and Labrador.

Featured in this booklet are: the Butchart Gardens, near Victoria, B.C., known for its sunken garden, the International Peace Garden, near Boissevain, on the Manitoba-North Dakota border, which symbolizes the peaceful relations between Canada and the U.S., the Royal Botanical Garden, Hamilton, Ont., known for the largest collection of lilacs in the world, the Montreal Botanical Garden, a highly respected horticultural centre and Canada's oldest surviving public garden, Halifax Gardens.
