IMPERIAL PENNY POSTAGE

1898

To introduce the adoption of the Imperial Penny Postage rate going into effect on Christmas Day, Canada's first Christmas stamp design showed a map of the world on Mercator's projection with British Possessions marked in red. The motto, 'We hold a vaster Empire than has been', is from 'A Song Of Empire' written by Sir Lewis Morris to honour the 50th Anniversary of Queen Victoria's reign.

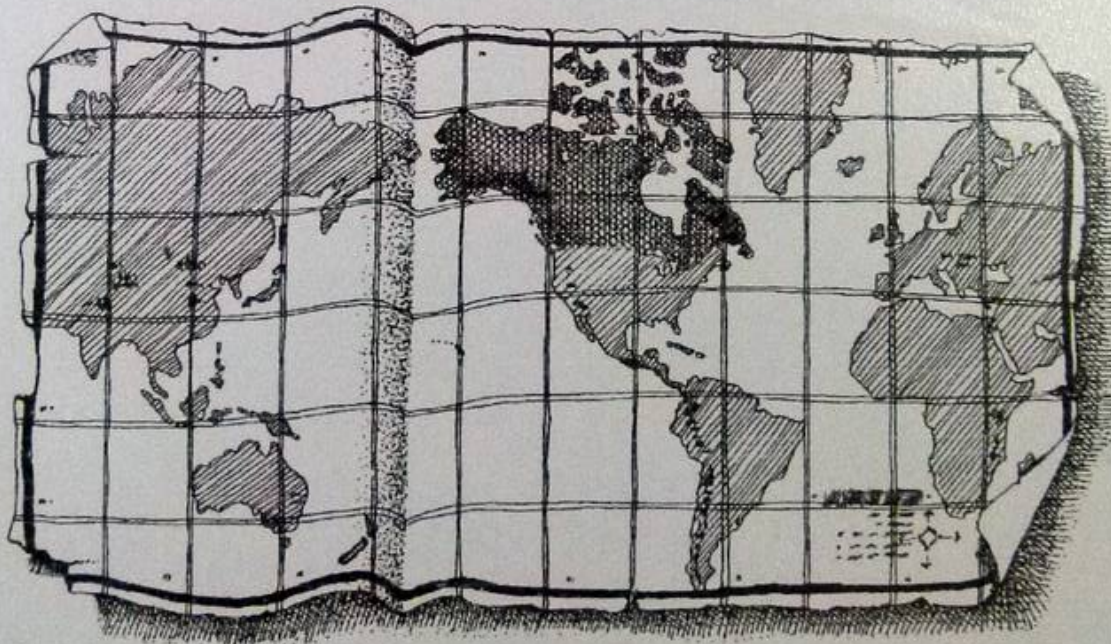

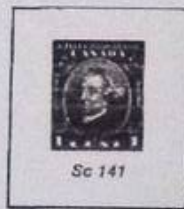


Fathers of the Confederation

Because of World War I, the 50th Anniversary of Confederation was celebrated with only a single stamp in 1917. The design is taken from the painting "Fathers of the Confederation" by Robert Harris and shows the meeting at the Parliament House in Quebec during the fall of 1864.

With the war over, the Post Office was less restrained and the 60th Anniversary of Confederation was celebrated in high style in 1927. Two separate sets of stamps were issued, one known as the commemorative series consisting of five stamps and a Special Delivery and a second set of three values called the 'historical' issue. Major political figures and settings of the Confederation movement are depicted.

CORONATION 1937



King George VI and Queen Elizabeth visited Canada in May and June, 1939. To mark the historic occasion of the first visit to Canada of a reigning monarch, a special set of stamps was issued. These were the first bi-coloured stamps since the Penny Post of 1898.

ICE VESSELS



These four ships were developed to combat the ever-dangerous Canadian winters and ice-covered waterways. The "Chief Justice Robinson," built in 1842, survived until 1857 and led to the building of the "Labrador" in 1954 for the Canadian navy. Today this vessel is used by the Coast Guard.

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT



Designed by Will Davies, these stamps depict men working with air drills in a hardrock silver mine and one of the gigantic bucket-wheel excavators used in strip mining.

WILDLIFE



The latest addition to the endangered species series features the peregrine falcon, which has suffered a drastic decline since World War II that scientists attribute to the widespread use of pesticides. The slow elimination of these pesticides is giving this world-known species a fighting chance for survival, but additional programs are needed to save this bird from extinction.

QUEBEC CARNIVAL



The Quebec Winter Carnival began sometime in the 19th century and then faded. Resurrected in 1954, the festival rivals the Carnival of Rio de Janeiro and the Mardi Gras of New Orleans.

ENDANGERED WILDLIFE

Its round, leathery shell earned the eastern spiny soft shelled turtle the nickname "pancake." The greatest threats to this species are water pollution, and the fact that people find them a delectable dish.



The commercial potential of the bowhead whale nearly caused its extinction. A single specimen could yield one and a half tons of lucrative whalebone and 25 tons of oil. They are easy to hunt because they are slow and do not sink when killed.

POSTAL CODE



When you don't want to forget something you tie a ribbon around your finger. A woman's finger on one stamp and a man's on the other, tied with ribbon and string serve as a reminder to use the postal code. The post office moves about six billion pieces of mail a year and the postal code makes this process much easier.

FREDERICK PHILLIP GROVE AND EMIL E NELLIGAN



German born Frederick Philip Grove left his homeland in 1909 under mysterious circumstances, emigrating to North America. He is best remembered for his realistic portrayals of life on the prairie during the years of rapid settlement. The stamp illustrates a scene from one of his books, *Fruits of the Earth*. Emile Nelligan's poetry is intensely personal. His short writing career ended when he sank into a profound depression, and from 1899, he spent the rest of his life in mental asylums. Monique Charbonneau's lovely woodcut celebrates his most famous poem, *Le Vaisseau D'or*.

DE SALABERRY AND JOHN BY



De Salaberry was commissioned in the British Army in 1794. He campaigned overseas and returned to Southern Canada in 1810. His most famous victory was the battle of Chateaugay in 1813. John By was commissioned in the Royal Artillery but was transferred to the Royal Engineers. He contributed to the building of both Quebec City and a canal at Les Cedres. In 1862, he supervised construction of the Rideau Canal, still in use today.

CANOE-KAYAK

In 1979, the Canoe-Kayak World Championships were held in Jonquiere and Desbiens, Quebec. This was the first time the event took place outside Europe. The course is at least 3 kilometers long and boasts numerous rapids, high waves, breakers and rollers.



WOMEN'S FIELD HOCKEY

About 40,000 Canadian women play field hockey. Fitness and stamina are essential for this popular sport since only two players can be substituted during a match. This year's World Championships took place in Vancouver.

INUIT SHELTER



The Inuit east of the Mackenzie River Delta used to live in tents during the summer. The tents were made of hides stretched over a frame of bones or driftwood. In the winter they moved to igloos. The average igloo was about three meters wide and two meters high and boasted a window of ice. It was warm and comfortable except for the disadvantage of cabin fever and if the igloo was erected on unstable ice, they could split apart and flood.



In marriage a person could legitimately have more than one spouse. The women butchered animals, cooked and sewed. A good seamstress was valued highly in the community because well made clothing allowed hunters to stand up in the coldest winter. While women also cared for the children, both parents gave them much affection.

U.N. YEAR OF THE CHILD



The United Nations General Assembly declared 1979 the year of world concern for the present condition of children all over the world. The stamp shows a young girl watering a tree to symbolize growth and nourishment.

Flying Boats



Flying boats are featured in the first series devoted to Canadian aircraft. These water-borne craft greatly improved access to lakes and rivers opened by the canoe.

Military Aircraft



The four military airplanes pictured have faithfully served brave Canadian pilots through many a battle. The Canadian Air Force is a highly respected military unit the world over.

Arctic Islands Centenary



In 1880, Canada acquired Britain's claims to the Arctic Islands. This crowned ten years of national growth which had seen Canada absorb British Columbia, the Hudson's Bay Company territories, and Prince Edward Island. This was the first time a country gained so much territory so peacefully and so quickly.

Winter Olympics



The Winter Olympics took place at Lake Placid, New York in February 1980. The stamp features an action photograph of a skier on a downhill run. The photographer deliberately uses an out-of-focus technique to show the speed of downhill skiing.

Endangered Wildlife



Atlantic whitefish live in southern Nova Scotia. They belong to the salmon family. The fish spawn in fresh water but spend their adult lives in the sea. Factors such as pollution, overfishing and deforestation threaten the existence of the Atlantic whitefish. Prairie farming originally helped the greater prairie chicken expand its population and range but hunters began to slaughter thousands and settlers plowed up more and more of the prairie. In the past ten years, with the exception of a few sightings in Saskatchewan, the bird has almost disappeared from Canada.

Gardening



One of the most popular leisure-time activities in Canada is gardening. From May 17 to September 1, Canada hosted *La Florales Internationales de Montreal*, one of the greatest horticultural exhibitions ever staged in North America.

Rehabilitation



The design of the stamp symbolizes the idea of people helping people — the motivating force behind rehabilitation. The Fourteenth World Congress of Rehabilitation International took place in Winnipeg, June 1980, as a prelude to the 1981 proclamation of the United Nations International Year for Disabled People.

John G. Diefenbaker



Diefenbaker was elected Prime Minister in 1957. Among the important things he was responsible for was the first woman federal cabinet minister, the first woman ambassador, enacting a bill of rights, and giving the Indians the right to vote. After his government was defeated in 1963, Diefenbaker resigned. He died in 1979.

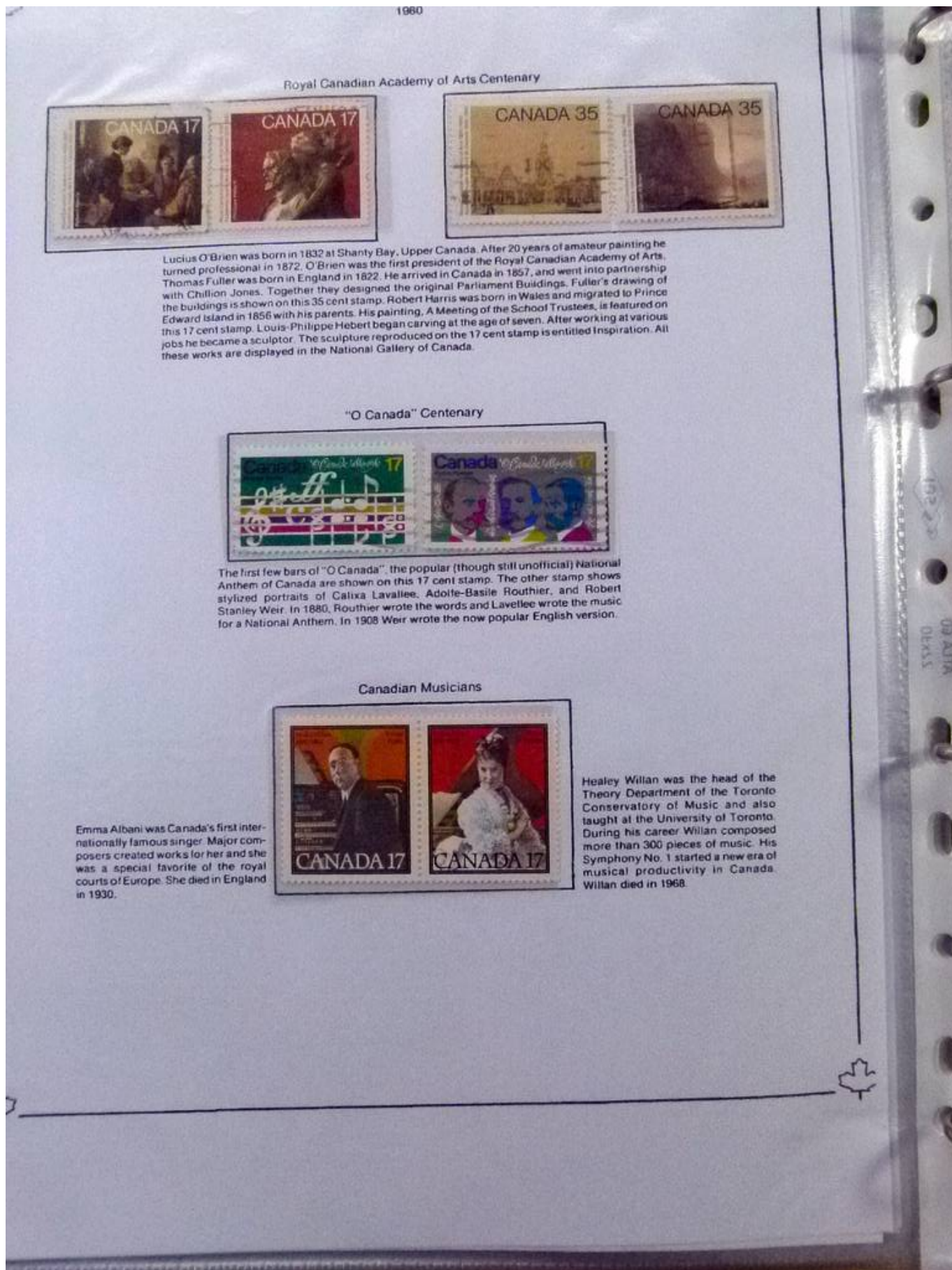

Saskatchewan and Alberta



Seventy-five years ago the federal government divided the Northwest Territory and created Saskatchewan and Alberta. These two provinces are major suppliers of the food and energy consumed in Canada. The two 17 cent stamps celebrate the agricultural wealth of the two provinces. The Alberta stamp shows strip farming and a small town with mountains in the background. The Saskatchewan stamp features grain elevators beside a railway track and surrounded by golden wheat fields.

Ned Hanlan



Just a little over 5'8" and never more than 155 pounds in his life, Ned Hanlan became the world's premier oarsman and in 1880, the first Canadian ever to win a world championship. The stamp is based on a contemporary photograph of Hanlan and the coloration is in keeping with the feeling of the late 19th Century.

Uranium



This 35 cent stamp celebrated Canada's uranium resources. In the early 1950's work began on the Candu nuclear power reactor system which is now recognized as the world's finest. By generating electricity with uranium instead of coal the system has already saved Canada one billion dollars and has eliminated the pollution that burning coal would have caused.

Inuit Spirits



The Inuit believed spiritual forces existed in every aspect of nature, not only in living things, but also in such inanimate objects as snow, rocks and wind and in conceptions such as sleep and a person's name. This close connection between the "natural" and "supernatural" affected customs in everyday life. Many believed that a woman named Sedna lived at the bottom of the sea and controlled the supply of sea animals. Inuits believed that shamans were intermediaries between the natural and spirit world. They could walk on water, turn themselves into animals, return from the dead and make themselves disappear.

Emmanuel-Persillier Lachapelle



Dr. Emmanuel-Persillier Lachapelle, an excellent physician was distinguished by his administrative talents. He was instrumental in reforming Quebec's laws governing medical practice and contributed greatly to the improvement of public health. But his major accomplishment was his role in the founding of Notre-Dame Hospital in Montreal in 1880. Today it is the largest French-speaking medical center in North America.

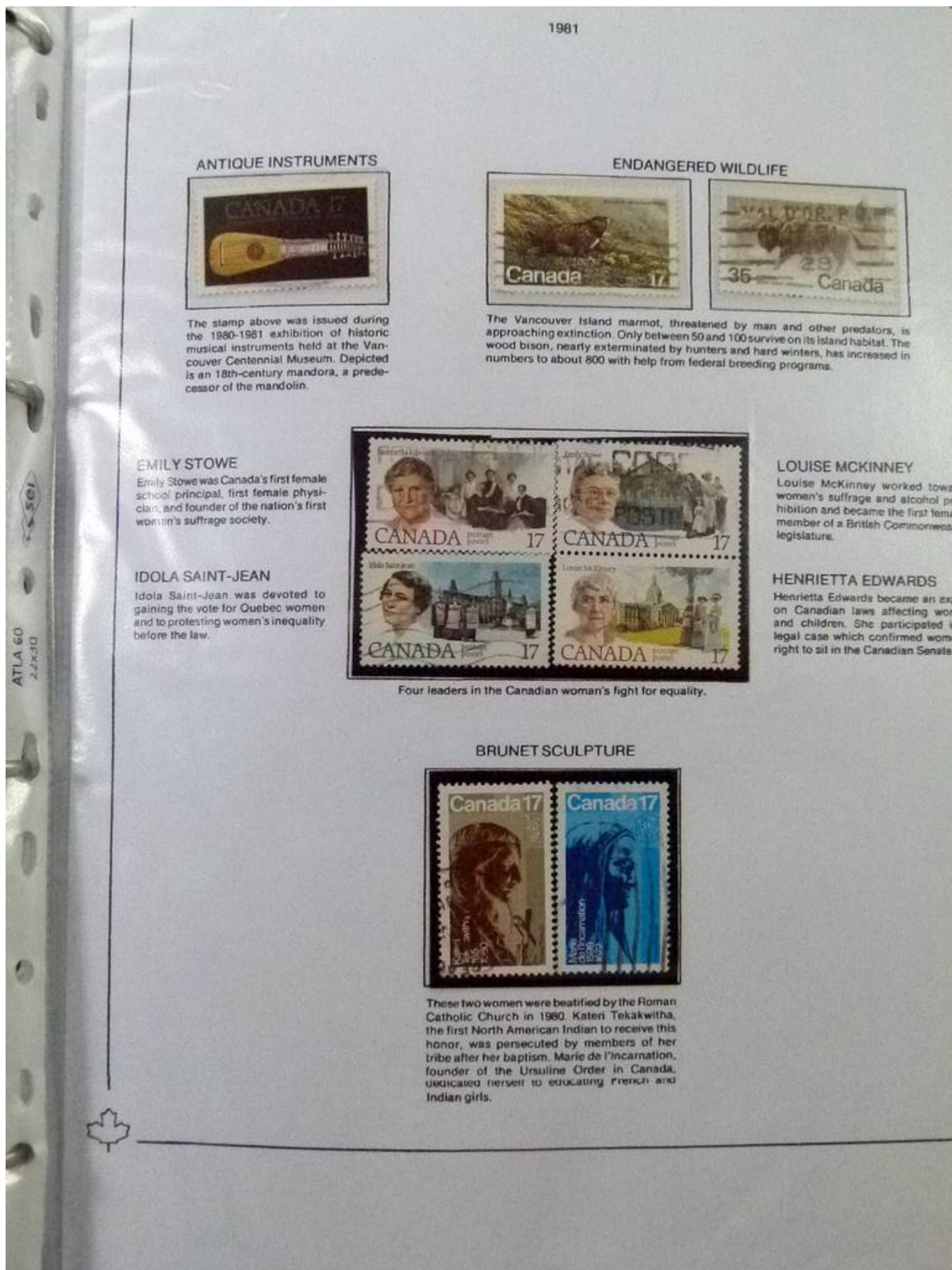

CANADIAN PAINTERS



Frederick H. Varley, a founding member of the Group of Seven, achieved greater notoriety from his landscapes, although he preferred painting people.



Marc-Aurèle Fortin believed that Canadian artists should take their inspiration from the countryside. Many of his works depict landscapes of the St. Lawrence Valley.



The paintings of Paul-Émile Borduas reflected his unshackled imagination. His style, called "automatisme," influenced many young painters.

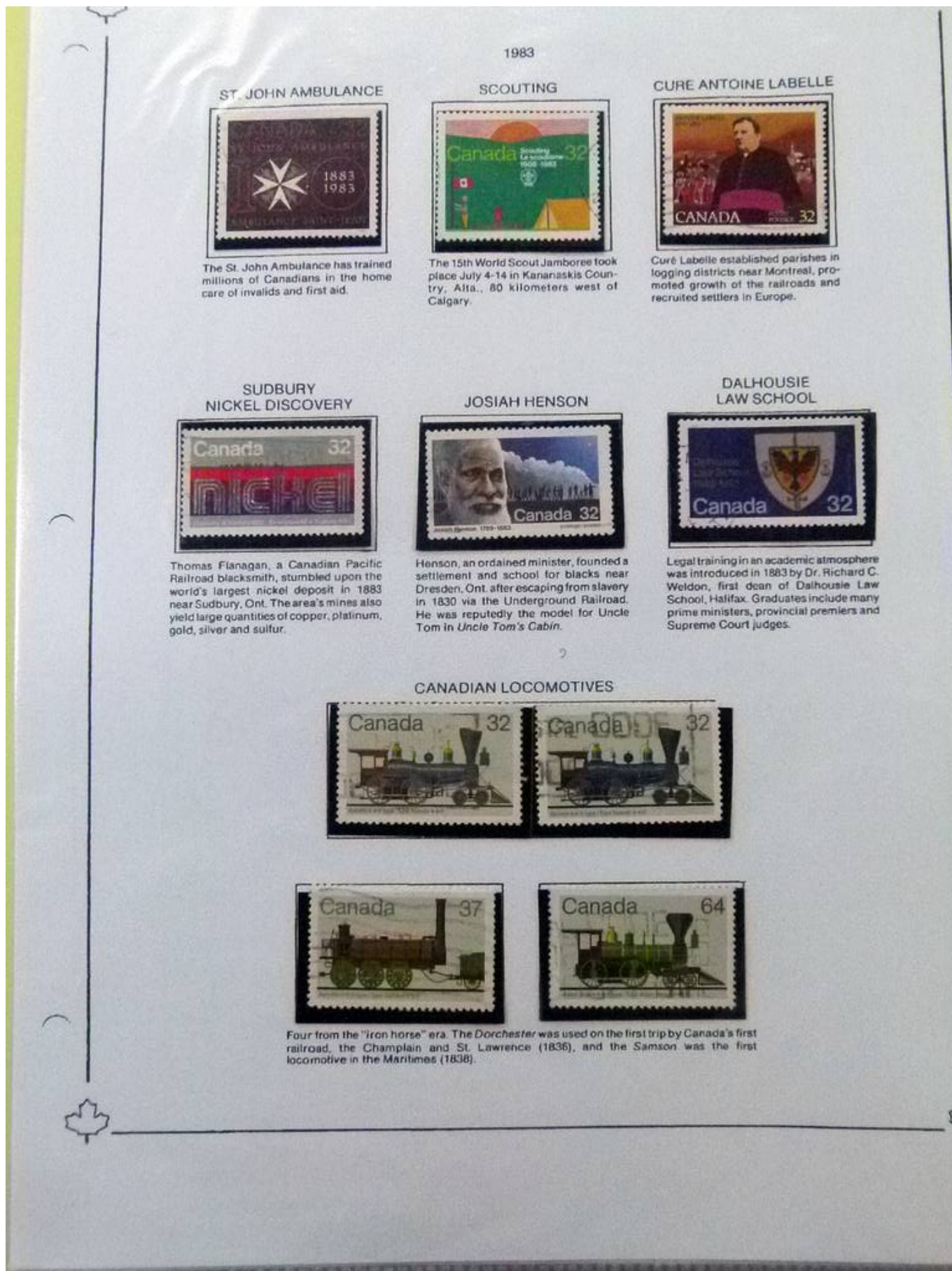

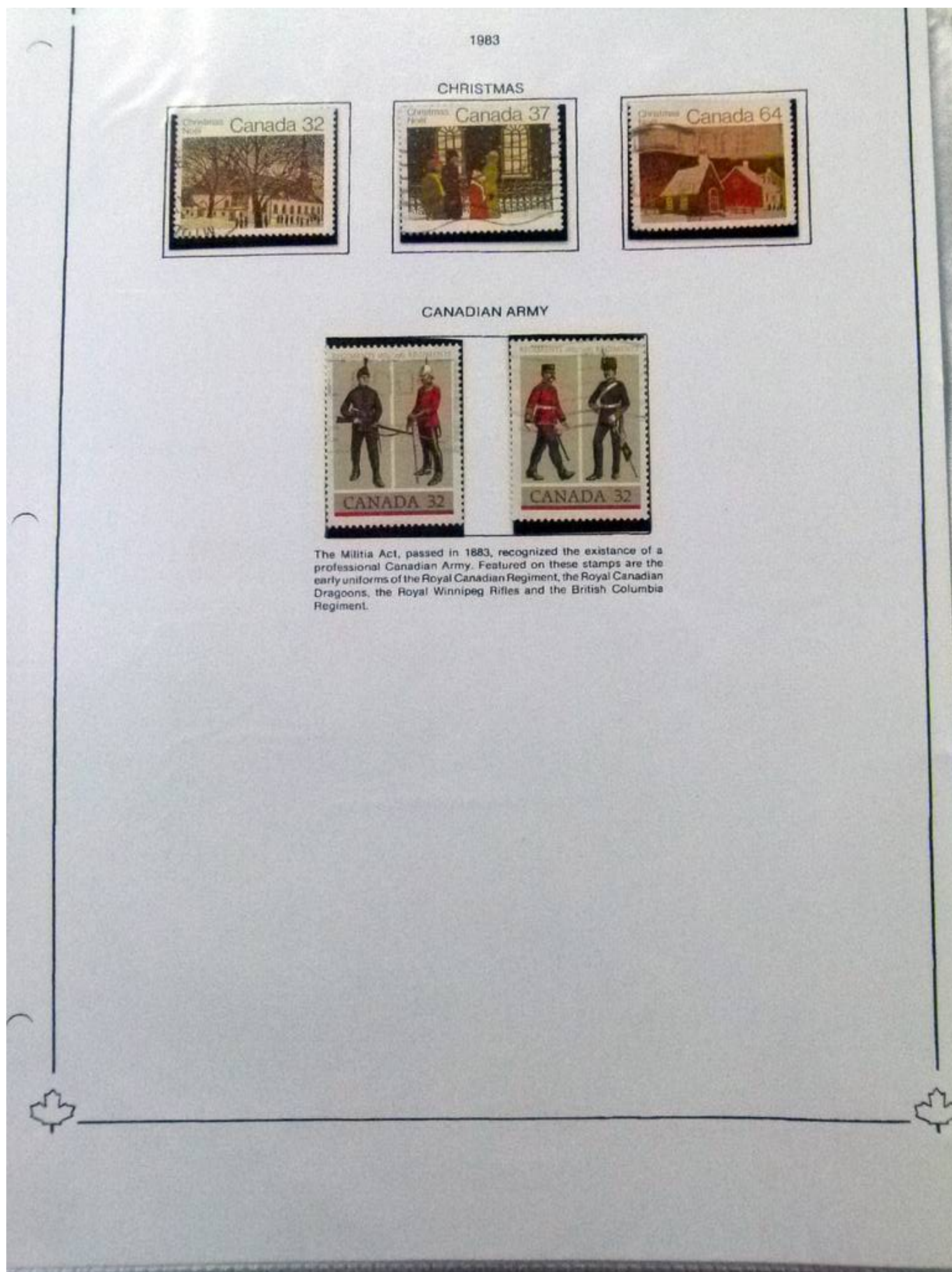

NEW BRUNSWICK



Loyalist refugees from the U.S. who desired self-government brought about New Brunswick's establishment as a province in 1784.

ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH IN NEWFOUNDLAND



The easing of Britain's anti-Roman Catholic laws in 1778 paved the way for Fr. James O'Donel's formal establishment of the Church in Newfoundland in 1784.

YEAR OF THE ARTS - MONTREAL SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA



The Montreal Symphony Orchestra made six international tours before this 50th anniversary stamp was issued. Directors have included Wilfrid Pelletier, Otto Klemperer and Zubin Mehta.

25TH ANNIVERSARY OF ST. LAWRENCE SEAWAY



The St. Lawrence Seaway opened the Great Lakes to world commerce. It was first discussed in 1900, started in 1954, completed in 1959.

UNITED EMPIRE LOYALISTS



Fleeing persecution in post-Revolutionary United States, some 50,000 Loyalists helped settle Upper and Lower Canada and the Maritime provinces.

TALL SHIPS



highlighted Quebec City's celebration of the anniversary of Cartier's voyage in 1534.

JACQUES CARTIER



Jacques Cartier on the 450th anniversary of his first voyage to this continent. He chartered the Gulf of St. Lawrence and landed at Gaspé.

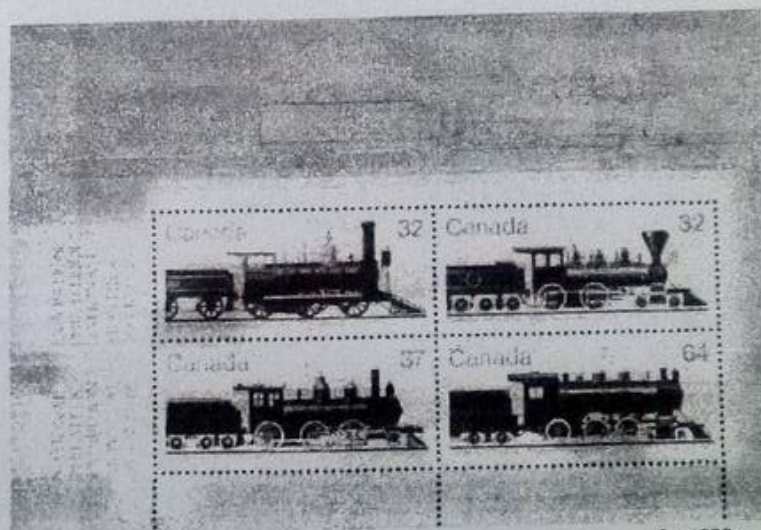
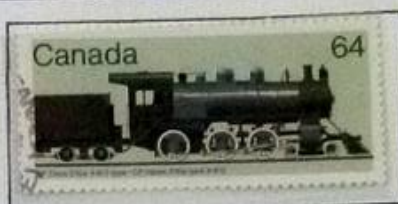
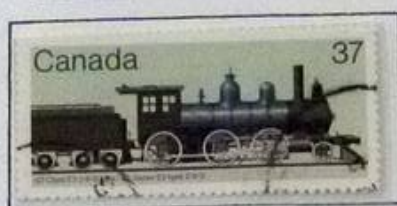
ROYAL CANADIAN AIR FORCE

BOOKLET STAMPS WILDERNESS RIVERS



Rivers shown in this booklet include the South Nahanni River which flows out of the Yukon and contains the scenic Virginia Falls, the Athabasca River, the longest river in Alberta, the Boundary Waters - Voyageur Waterway which flows between Canada and the U.S., the Jacques-Cartier River in Quebec, known for its beauty and historic value as an early travel and trade route, and the Main River, on the Great Northern Peninsula, one of the last remaining near-wilderness areas of Newfoundland and Labrador.

PUBLIC GARDENS



Featured in this booklet are: the Butchart Gardens, near Victoria, B.C., known for its sunken garden, the International Peace Garden, near Boissevain, on the Manitoba-North Dakota border, which symbolizes the peaceful relations between Canada and the U.S., the Royal Botanical Garden, Hamilton, Ont., known for the largest collection of lilacs in the world, the Montreal Botanical Garden, a highly respected horticultural centre and Canada's oldest surviving public garden, Halifax Gardens.

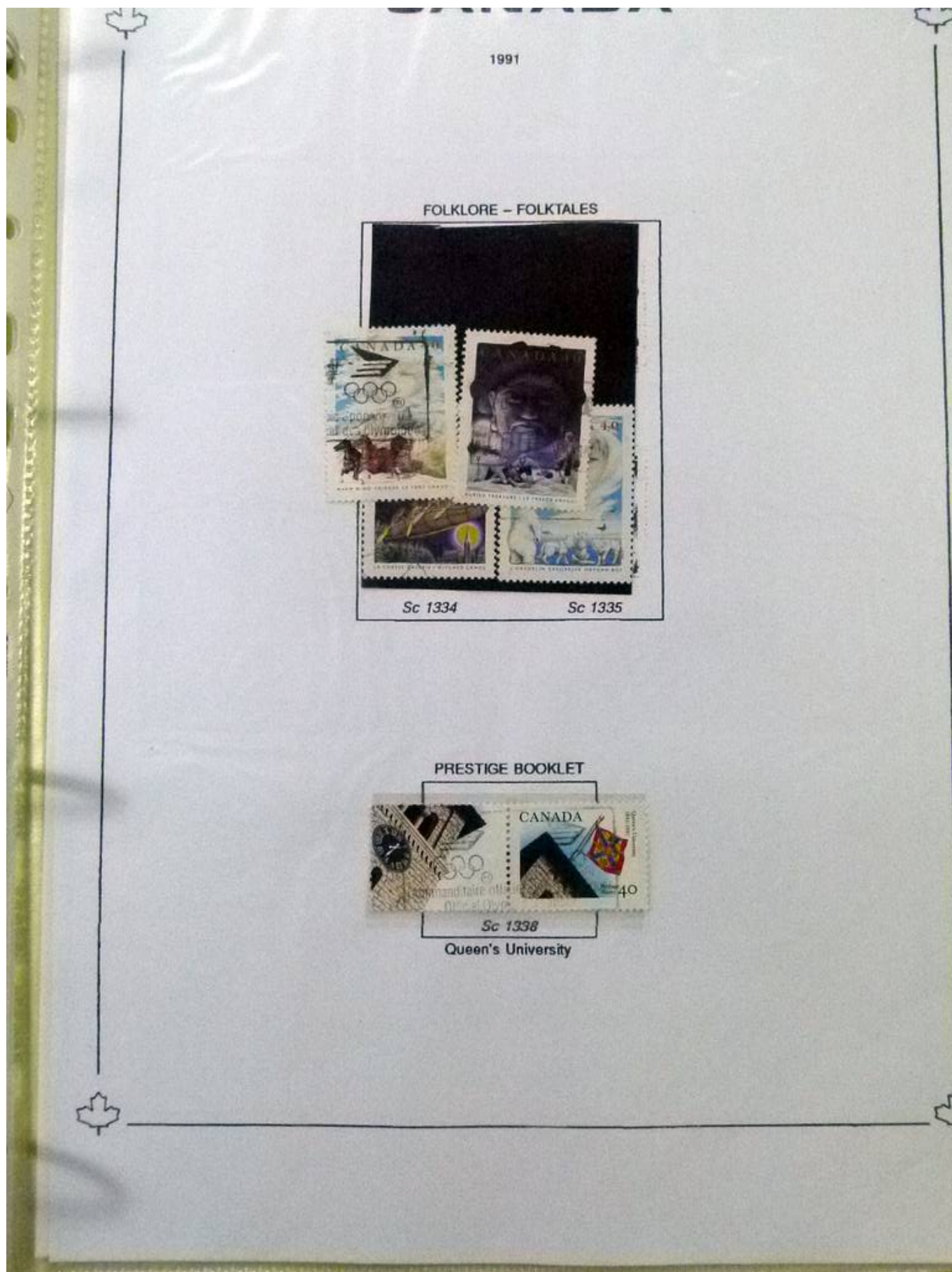

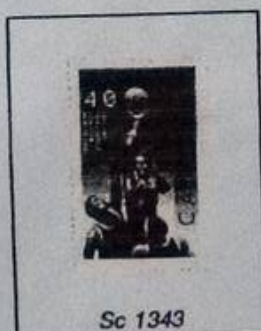

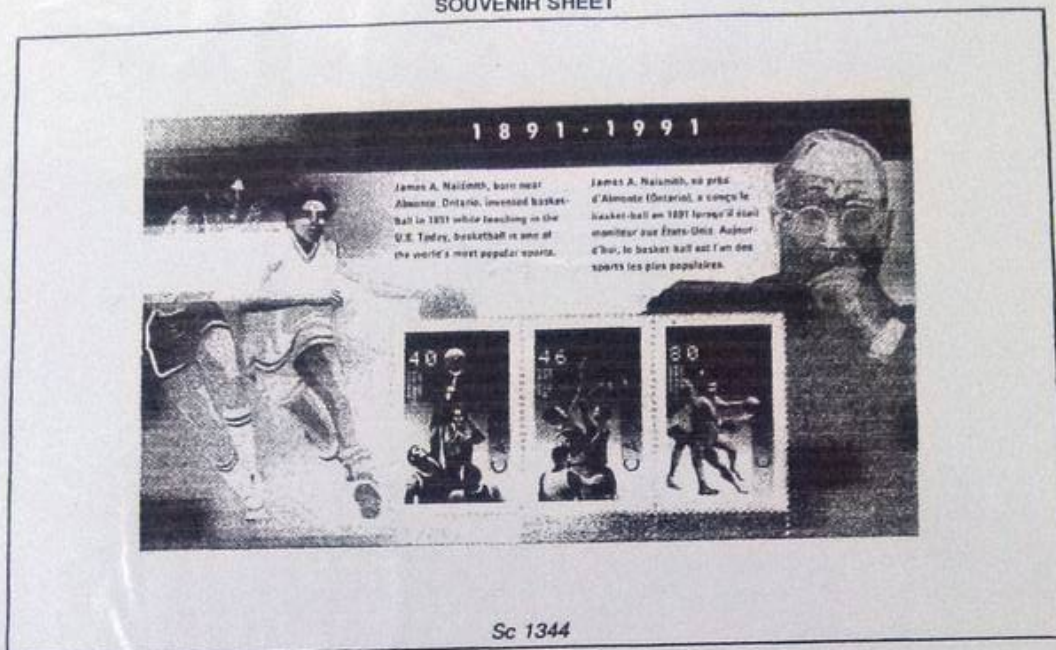

ARRIVAL OF THE UKRAINIANS



The Ukrainian Pioneer, a painting by William Kurelek, is featured on this block of four depicting the many hardships faced by these immigrants.

DANGEROUS PUBLIC SERVICE OCCUPATIONS



Those in dangerous public service occupations are saluted with this block of four. Search and rescue operations respond to about 9,000 incidents per year. Municipal police forces, which first appeared in Canada in the 1830's were patterned after the London Metropolitan Police. Firefighting is physically demanding and stressful. The Canadian Ski Patrol System began in 1940 and came to the aid of 15,000 skiers in one two-year period.
