DOMINION OF CANADA
The dream of a unified expansion into the territories of the North and West was brought closer to reality by the growth of the Canadian railroad system bridging the barriers of distance between the provinces and making confederation a reality. The Quebec Conference of 1864 framed the resolutions forming the basis of the British North America Act which on July 1, 1867 united the Provinces of Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick into the Dominion of Canada.

The "Large Queens" were the first stamps issued by the new Dominion.

DIAMOND JUBILEE

Celebration of Queen Victoria's 60th reigning year inspired Canada's first and longest commemorative series. The stamps each featured two vignettes of the Queen. The one from the famous Chalon portrait shows her shortly after her Coronation. The Von Angell portrait shows her in later life. The letters "VRI" stand for "Victoria Regina Imperatrix" or, Victoria, Queen and Empress.







KING EDWARD VII
1903-1908

Queen Victoria died January 29, 1901, but the new series bearing the portrait of her son, King Edward VII, did not appear until Dominion Day, 1903. The stamp was designed by the Prince of Wales, later King George V, with J. A. Tilleard of the Royal Philatelic Society, London.









KING GEORGE ADMIRAL SERIES
1912-1925

The death of King Edward made a new definitive series necessary. The vignette is King George V in the full dress uniform of an Admiral of the Fleet of the Royal Navy. Although King George succeeded to the throne on May 6, 1910, stamps bearing his portrait did not appear until January 1, 1912.



1917



Fathers of the Confederation

Because of World War I, the 50th Anniversary of Confederation was celebrated with only a single stamp in 1917. The design is taken from the painting "Fathers of the Confederation" by Robert Harris and shows the meeting at the Parliament House in Quebec during the fall of 1864.

With the war over, the Post Office was less restrained and the 60th Anniversary of Confederation was celebrated in high style in 1927. Two separate sets of stamps were issued, one known as the commemorative series consisting of five stamps and a Special Delivery and a second set of three values called the 'historical' issue. Major political figures and settings of the Confederation movement are depicted.





KING GEORGE VI SERIES
1937

The Prince of Wales ascended the throne upon the death of King George V in January, 1936 and became King Edward VII. Stamps were being prepared, but had not been issued when he abdicated in December, giving the throne to his brother, the Duke of York, who became King George VI. The design planned for King Edward was used for the new king. This issue was the first Canadian series to depict the king in civilian attire.



1947-1949

CANADIAN CITIZENSHIP
Passage of the Citizenship Act gave Canadian citizenship to those residents who qualified on July 1, 1947. Prior to that date all Canadians were British subjects. The design is a symbolical Canadian greeting the new day.

ALEXANDER GRAHAM BELL
Issued to commemorate the centenary of the birth of Alexander Graham Bell. Dr. Bell worked out his theory and gave his first successful demonstration of the telephone while living in Brantford, Ontario. He died in 1922 at his summer home in Nova Scotia.

PRINCESS ELIZABETH
Issued to commemorate the November 29, 1947 marriage of H.R.H. Princess Elizabeth to Lieutenant Philip Mountbatten of the Royal Navy.

RESPONSIBLE GOVERNMENT
Celebrating 100 years of Canadian Responsible Government with freedom from control by the Home Office at London.

NEWFOUNDLAND ENTRY INTO CONFEDERATION
John Cabot and his crew of 18 men in the small ship 'Matthew' are credited with landing in Newfoundland in 1497. On April 1, 1849, Newfoundland joined the Confederation.

FOUNDING OF HALIFAX
Halifax, capital of Nova Scotia, founded in 1749, is the leading commercial and cultural city of the Province and a major Canadian port. Stamp depicts the original settlement.





1951

Right Honourable Sir Robert Laird Borden, Prime Minister from 1911 to 1920. Directed the mobilization of resources in the war effort. One of the architects of dominion autonomy.

The Right Honourable William Lyon Mackenzie King, Prime Minister 1921-1926 and 1935-1938. Great war-time premier. His guiding principles were national unity and respect for French-Canadian identity.

PRIME MINISTERS
Issued to commemorate Prime Ministers who had not been honoured on previous postal issues.

1952

The Honourable Sir John Joseph Caldwell Abbott, Prime Minister from 1891 to 1892.

The Honourable Alexander Mackenzie, Prime Minister from 1873 to 1878. The Supreme Court of Canada was established during his administration.

1954

The Right Honourable Sir John Sparrow David Thompson, Prime Minister from 1892 to 1894. One of the arbitrators in the Bering Sea seal fishery dispute. Died suddenly in 1894 at Windsor Castle.

The Right Honourable Sir Mackenzie Bowell, Prime Minister from 1894 to 1896. Saw vigorous expansion of the Canadian West leading to peaceful conquest of the great new country.

1955

The Right Honourable Richard Bedford Bennett, Prime Minister from 1930 to 1935. Largely responsible for the 1932 Ottawa Economic Conference.

The Honourable Sir Charles Tupper, Prime Minister from May 1 to July 8, 1896. Held high offices in Canada for over forty years. Last survivor of the "Fathers of the Confederation."

1951 ROYAL VISIT
The first royal visit to Canada by Princess Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh was celebrated by a stamp bearing their portraits.

1952 RED CROSS
Issued to publicize the 18th International Red Cross Conference held July 28, 1952 in Toronto. The first modern Canadian stamp to use a combination of lithography and engraving.

1953 CORONATION QUEEN ELIZABETH II
Medallion Sculpture of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Designed for the Coronation Issue by Emanuel Hahn, R.C.A., SSC, Toronto.

WILDLIFE SERIES 1953-1957
The Canadian Wildlife Service tries to conserve one of Canada's most valuable resources. This series was issued to enlighten the public of the need for preserving endangered species.





**QUEBEC
350TH ANNIVERSARY**

In June, 1608 Samuel de Champlain with a band of 26 men cut a clearing on the site of what is now the Lower Town of Quebec. The English seized the settlement in 1629, but in 1633 Champlain once again took possession in the name of the King of France and built a new and larger 'Habitation.'

HEALTH

Emphasizes the importance of health to the individual and to the nation

FIRST ELECTED ASSEMBLY

The speaker's chair and mace, representing the first Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia met October 2, 1758 in the Court House at Halifax. This was Canada's first elected Assembly, the first step towards today's self-government.

PETROLEUM

Issued to honour Canadian oil industry development and the 1958 Montreal World Power Conference.

N.A.T.O.

Shown are North Atlantic area and dove of peace. 'O.T.A.N.' on the right stands for Organisation Du Traité De L'Atlantique Du Nord.

FIRST AIRPLANE FLIGHT

'Jack' McCurdy's bi-plane 'Silver Dart', with a 50 horse power engine and a wing spread of 40 feet, made a half mile powered flight near Baddeck, N.S. on June 23, 1909. The next day he took it up again and flew eight miles in eleven minutes, eight seconds.

COUNTRY WOMEN

Honours affiliations of women of rural communities.

ARTHUR MEIGHEN

Prime Minister from 1920-21 and again in 1926. Chief proponent of nationalizing all major railroads except the Canadian Pacific.

JEAN TALON

Administrator of New France from 1665-1688. Encouraged industry and farming and brought in young French ladies to become wives of bachelor settlers.

EDUCATION

'Strength through Education' symbolised by illustrations of more than 30 facets of education.

NATURAL RESOURCES VICTORIA CENTENARY

Row, issued to publicize the close link between industry and the country's renewable natural resources.

Victoria, the first and second largest city of British Columbia, was founded as a fur trading headquarters.

RED RIVER SETTLEMENT - 1812

In spite of fur traders' attempts to keep them out, Thomas Douglas, Earl of Selkirk, and a small band of Scottish Highlanders established a colony on the Red River.

TRANS-CANADA HIGHWAY

Commemorating the official opening of the world's longest highway.

COLOMBO PLAN

Tenth anniversary of Plan under which the Commonwealth countries extended technical and financial aid to Asian countries.

An engineer, he mapped the route for the Inter-colonial Railway, promoted the Pacific cable and designed Canada's first stamp, the "Three Penny Beaver."

MARGUERITE D'YOUVILLE



"The strong woman of Canada" . . . "A woman of genius" are two of the tributes that have been paid to this founder of the Grey Nuns religious order. The stamp depicts an incident in 1760 during the general famine when food supplies mysteriously appeared in the refectory.

These four ships were developed to combat the ever-dangerous Canadian winters and ice-covered waterways. The "Chief Justice Robinson," built in 1842, survived until 1857 and led to the building of the "Labrador" in 1954 for the Canadian navy. Today this vessel is used by the Coast Guard.



Designed by Will Davies, these stamps depict men working with air drills in a hardrock silver mine and one of the gigantic bucket-wheel excavators used in strip mining.



The latest addition to the endangered species series features the peregrine falcon, which has suffered a drastic decline since World War II that scientists attribute to the widespread use of pesticides. The slow elimination of these pesticides is giving this world-known species a fighting chance for survival, but additional programs are needed to save this bird from extinction.

QUEBEC CARNIVAL

The Quebec Winter Carnival began sometime in the 19th century and then faded. Resurrected in 1954, the festival rivals the Carnival of Rio de Janeiro and the Mardi Gras of New Orleans.

ENDANGERED WILDLIFE

Its round, leathery shell earned the eastern spiny soft-shelled turtle the nickname "pancake." The greatest threats to this species are water pollution, and the fact that people find them a delectable dish.

The commercial potential of the bowhead whale nearly caused its extinction. A single specimen could yield one and a half tons of lucrative whalebone and 25 tons of oil. They are easy to hunt because they are slow and do not sink when killed.

POSTAL CODE

When you don't want to forget something you tie a ribbon around your finger. A woman's finger on one stamp and a man's on the other, tied with ribbon and string serve as a reminder to use the postal code. The post office moves about six billion pieces of mail a year and the postal code makes this process much easier.

FREDERICK PHILLIP GROVE AND EMILE NELLIGAN

German born Frederick Philip Grove left his homeland in 1909 under mysterious circumstances, emigrating to North America. He is best remembered for his realistic portrayals of life on the prairie during the years of rapid settlement. The stamp illustrates a scene from one of his books, *Fruits of the Earth*. Emile Nelligan's poetry is intensely personal. His short writing career ended when he sank into a profound depression, and from 1899, he spent the rest of his life in mental asylums. Monique Charbonneau's lovely woodcut celebrates his most famous poem, *Le Vaisseau D'or*.

DE SALABERRY AND JOHN BY

De Salaberry was commissioned in the British Army in 1794. He campaigned overseas and returned to Southern Canada in 1810. His most famous victory was the battle of Chateauguay in 1813. John By was commissioned in the Royal Artillery but was transferred to the Royal Engineers. He contributed to the building of both Quebec City and a canal at Les Cedres. In 1862, he supervised construction of the Rideau Canal, still in use today.

CANOE-KAYAK

In 1979, the Canoe-Kayak World Championships were held in Jonquiere and Desbiens, Quebec. This was the first time the event took place outside Europe. The course is at least 3 kilometers long and boasts numerous rapids, high waves, breakers and rollers.

WOMEN'S FIELD HOCKEY

About 40,000 Canadian women play field hockey. Fitness and stamina are essential for this popular sport since only two players can be substituted during a match. This year's World Championships took place in Vancouver.

<p>The Inuit east of the Mackenzie River Delta used to live in tents during the summer. The tents were made of hides stretched over a frame of bones or driftwood. In the winter they moved to igloos. The average igloo was about three meters wide and two meters high and boasted a window of ice. It was warm and comfortable except for the disadvantage of cabin fever and if the igloo was erected on unstable ice, they could split apart and flood.</p> <p>In marriage a person could legitimately have more than one spouse. The women butchered animals, cooked and sewed. A good seamstress was valued highly in the community because well made clothing allowed hunters to stand up in the coldest winter. While women also cared for the children, both parents gave them much affection.</p>

Arctic Islands Centenary



In 1880, Canada acquired Britain's claims to the Arctic Islands. This crowned ten years of national growth which had seen Canada absorb British Columbia, the Hudson's Bay Company territories, and Prince Edward Island. This was the first time a country gained so much territory so peacefully and so quickly.

Winter Olympics



The Winter Olympics took place at Lake Placid, New York in February 1980. The stamp features an action photograph of a skier on a downhill run. The photographer deliberately uses an out-of-focus technique to show the speed of downhill skiing.

Endangered Wildlife



Atlantic whitefish live in southern Nova Scotia. They belong to the salmon family. The fish spawn in fresh water but spend their adult lives in the sea. Factors such as pollution, overfishing and deforestation threaten the existence of the Atlantic whitefish. Prairie farming originally helped the greater prairie chicken expand its population and range but hunters began to slaughter thousands and settlers plowed up more and more of the prairie. In the past ten years, with the exception of a few sightings in Saskatchewan, the bird has almost disappeared from Canada.

Gardening



One of the most popular leisure-time activities in Canada is gardening. From May 17 to September 1, Canada hosted *Le Floralia Internationales de Montréal*, one of the greatest horticultural exhibitions ever staged in North America.

Rehabilitation



The design of the stamp symbolizes the idea of people helping people — the motivating force behind rehabilitation. The Fourteenth World Congress of Rehabilitation International took place in Winnipeg, June 1980, as a prelude to the 1981 proclamation of the United Nations International Year for Disabled People.

John G. Diefenbaker



Diefenbaker was elected Prime Minister in 1957. Among the important things he was responsible for was the first woman federal cabinet minister, the first woman ambassador, enacting a bill of rights, and giving the Indians the right to vote. After his government was defeated in 1963, Diefenbaker resigned. He died in 1979.



Seventy-five years ago the federal government divided the Northwest Territory and created Saskatchewan and Alberta. These two provinces are major suppliers of the food and energy consumed in Canada. The two 17 cent stamps celebrate the agricultural wealth of the two provinces. The Alberta stamp shows strip farming and a small town with mountains in the background. The Saskatchewan stamp features grain elevators beside a railway track and surrounded by golden wheat fields.

Ned Hanlan



Just a little over 5'8" and never more than 155 pounds in his life, Ned Hanlan became the world's premier oarsman and in 1880, the first Canadian ever to win a world championship. The stamp is based on a contemporary photograph of Hanlan and the coloration is in keeping with the feeling of the late 19th Century.

Uranium



This 35 cent stamp celebrated Canada's uranium resources. In the early 1950's work began on the Candu nuclear power reactor system which is now recognized as the world's finest. By generating electricity with uranium instead of coal the system has already saved Canada one billion dollars and has eliminated the pollution that burning coal would have caused.



ANTIQUE INSTRUMENTS

The stamp above was issued during the 1980-1981 exhibition of historic musical instruments held at the Vancouver Centennial Museum. Depicted is an 18th-century mandora, a predecessor of the mandolin.

ENDANGERED WILDLIFE

The Vancouver Island marmot, threatened by man and other predators, is approaching extinction. Only between 50 and 100 survive on its island habitat. The wood bison, nearly exterminated by hunters and hard winters, has increased in numbers to about 800 with help from federal breeding programs.

EMILY STOWE
Emily Stowe was Canada's first female school principal, first female physician, and founder of the nation's first women's suffrage society.

IDOLA SAINT-JEAN
Idola Saint-Jean was devoted to gaining the vote for Quebec women and to protesting women's inequality before the law.

LOUISE MCKINNEY
Louise McKinney worked toward women's suffrage and alcohol prohibition and became the first female member of a British Commonwealth legislature.

Four leaders in the Canadian woman's fight for equality.

HENRIETTA EDWARDS
Henrietta Edwards became an expert on Canadian laws affecting women and children. She participated in legal case which confirmed women's right to sit in the Canadian Senate.

BRUNET SCULPTURE

These two women were beatified by the Roman Catholic Church in 1980. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first North American Indian to receive this honor, was persecuted by members of her tribe after her baptism. Marie de l'Incarnation, founder of the Ursuline Order in Canada, dedicated herself to educating French and Indian girls.

Frederick H. Varley, a founding member of the Group of Seven, achieved greater notoriety from his landscapes, although he preferred painting people.

Honored are four explorers of the North who traversed lands and water where no one dared to venture. The Chipewyan Indian leader Malonabbe was a guide for the Hearne expedition. Sir John Franklin set sail in search of the fabled Northwest Passage. Joseph Burr Tyrrell discovered the fossil beds of Alberta, and entered the barren lands. Vilhjalmur Stefansson studied native peoples and discovered the islands in the Arctic Archipelago.
