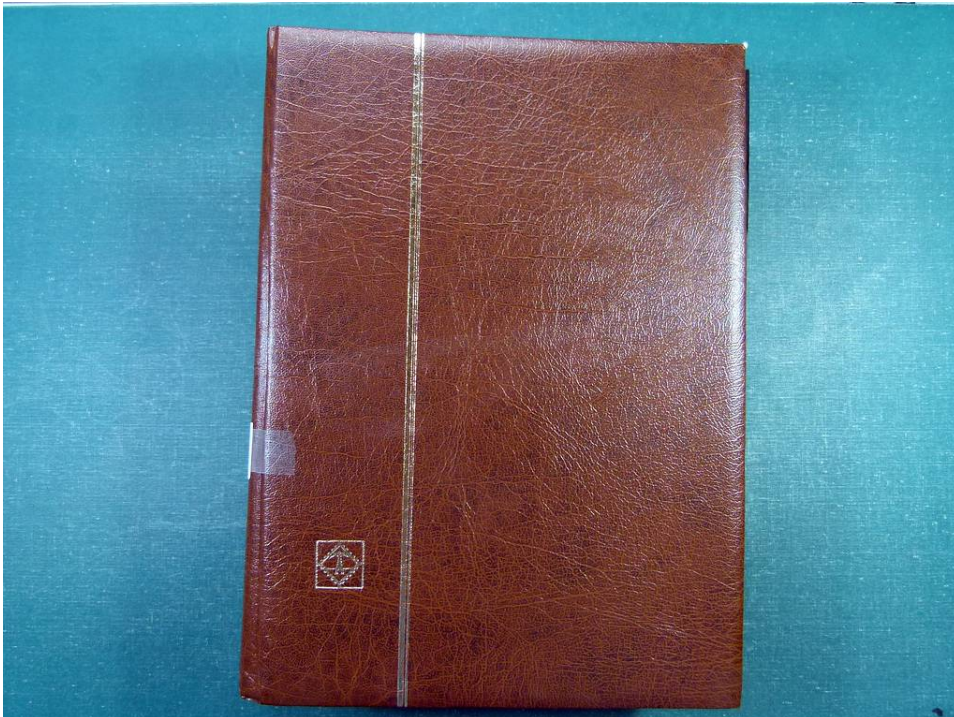

In May 1840, only 1d & 2d value stamps were issued, primarily for use on internal mail. In 1841, the embossing of stamps on envelopes began, and it was the success of these early envelopes which led the Post Office to consider embossing for the first high value stamps.

By 1846, there was a demand for adhesive stamps to meet overseas postage rates. As a result, it was decided to issue a 1/- stamp. The Post Office were asked to recommend the method of production and they advised embossing. The 1/- green value was issued in 1847 and was followed by the 10d brown and the 6d purple. However, the cost of embossing proved too great and the Post Office reverted to surface printing in 1856.
